

Experiences and challenges in conducting the first GPS in the Republic of Macedonia



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Introduction

First GPS in the country

Supported by EMCDDA

Period of implementation: less than 7 months

Implementing agency: Institute of Public Health

In collaboration with the 10 regional Centers for Public Health and the Institute of Epidemiology (Medical Faculty)

Other surveys conducted in the country:

- ESPAD: 1999, 2008, 2012, 2015
- HBSC
- Global youth tobacco survey

**Report: Assessment of Drug Dependence Treatment
Quality Standards for Drug Dependence Treatment
Programs in the Republic of Macedonia**

Pilot phase

- Sample 147 (3% of the sampling size)
- Conducted in the capital, Skopje (urban and rural)
- Questionnaire in Macedonian and Albanian language
- Response rate: 75,5%

Timing:

- Training of the staff 21.12.2016
- Field work 22.12.2016-05.01.2017
- Reported 09.01.2017

Second phase

- Modification of the questionnaire (based on the pilot phase findings and EMCDDA recommendations)
- Reporting forms, contact lists
- Additional training of the staff 08.02.2017
- Field work and data entry/control 09.02-26.03.2017
- Reporting 31.03.2017

Sample

5005 households selected:

- 3500 aged 15-64
- Additional 1505 aged 15-34 (over-represented)
- Data: Latest census in 2002 (framework error 15%)
- Stratification: 8 statistical regions (urban and rural)
- Monitoring coverage: 10%

Field work challenges

1. Staff

- Motivation of the staff (weather, time limit)
- Refusal to participate, new interviewers engaged locally (no training, insufficient knowledge in methodology)
- Inadequate reporting (contact lists: not fulfilled, or lacking information for the second/third visit, reason for not participation)
- Monitoring: poor reporting

Field work challenges (2)

2. Environment

- Old data for the households (census)
 - Weather conditions
 - Access to households
 - Environment specifics (rural, urban)
 - Absence/migration
- Motivation of participants to take part in the study



Field work challenges (3)

3. Household, Interview

- Face to face
- Sensitive questions
- Privacy
- Anonymity



Reporting challenges

- Missing household's codes
- Insufficient data for no-participation
- Weekly reports delays, insufficient information
- Delays in submission of fulfilled questionnaires
- Double reporting

Data entry challenges

- Font (Macedonian, Albanian, English)

Eg. Kr. Palanka, K Palanka, Кр. Паланка, Крива Паланка;
Vatasha, Vatasa, Ваташа

- Location codes not used

- Formatted cells

(date 12.3.17, 12.3.2017, 12/03/2017, 12.3, 1203,
time 12:20; 12,20, 12.20h, 1220)

- No answer codes (99 no answer, 0 not applicable)
- Contact lists not fulfilled
- Double reporting

Household

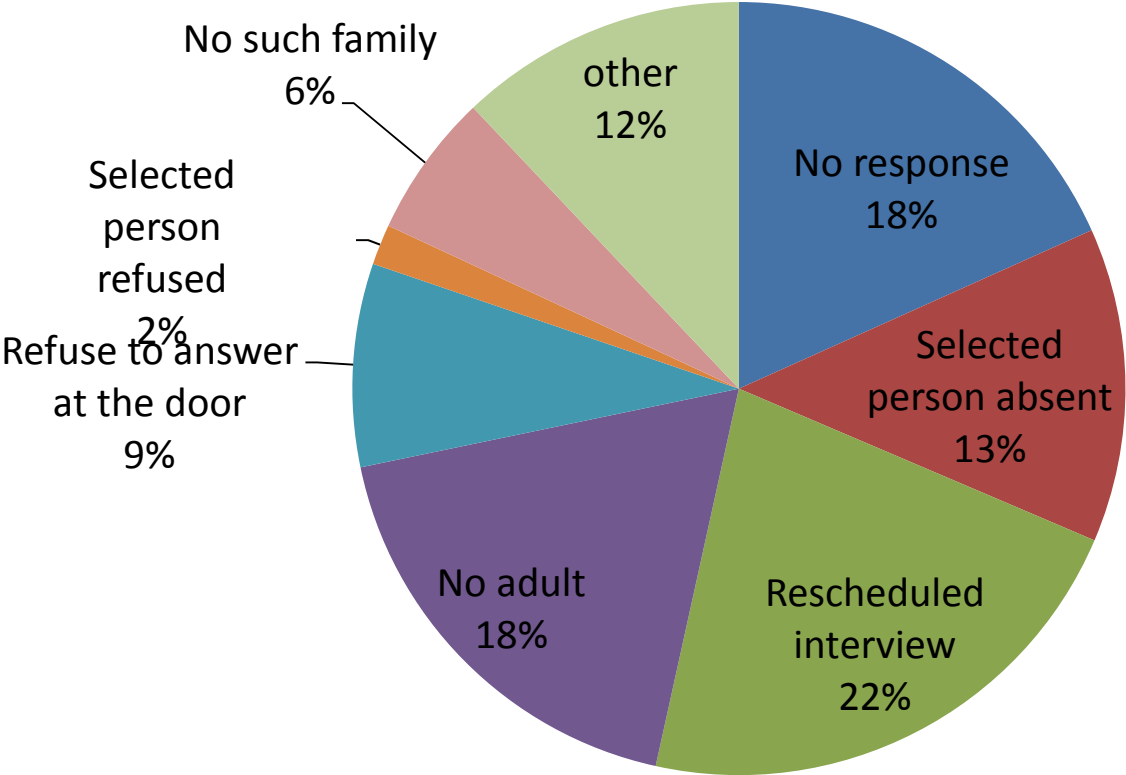

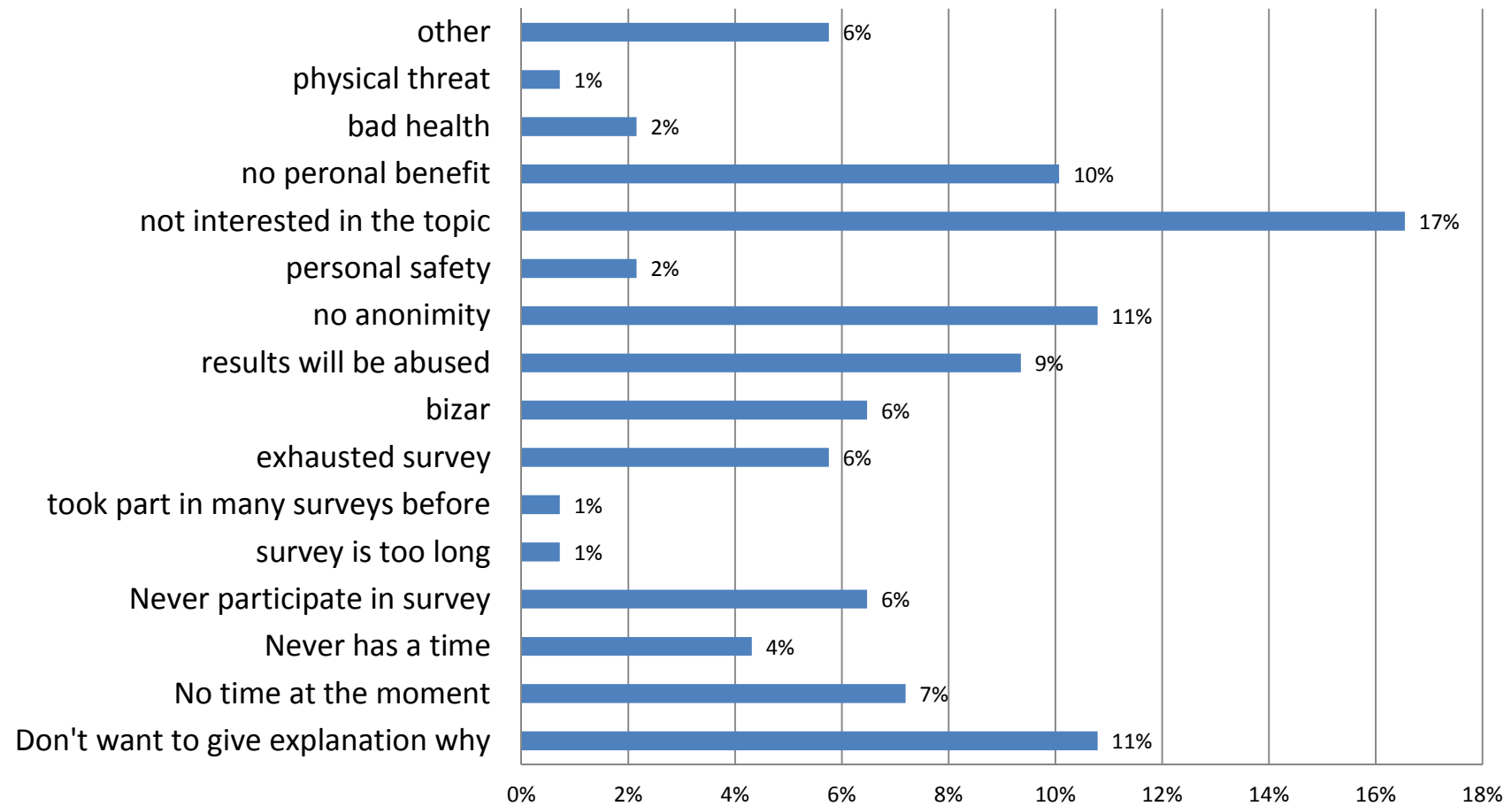

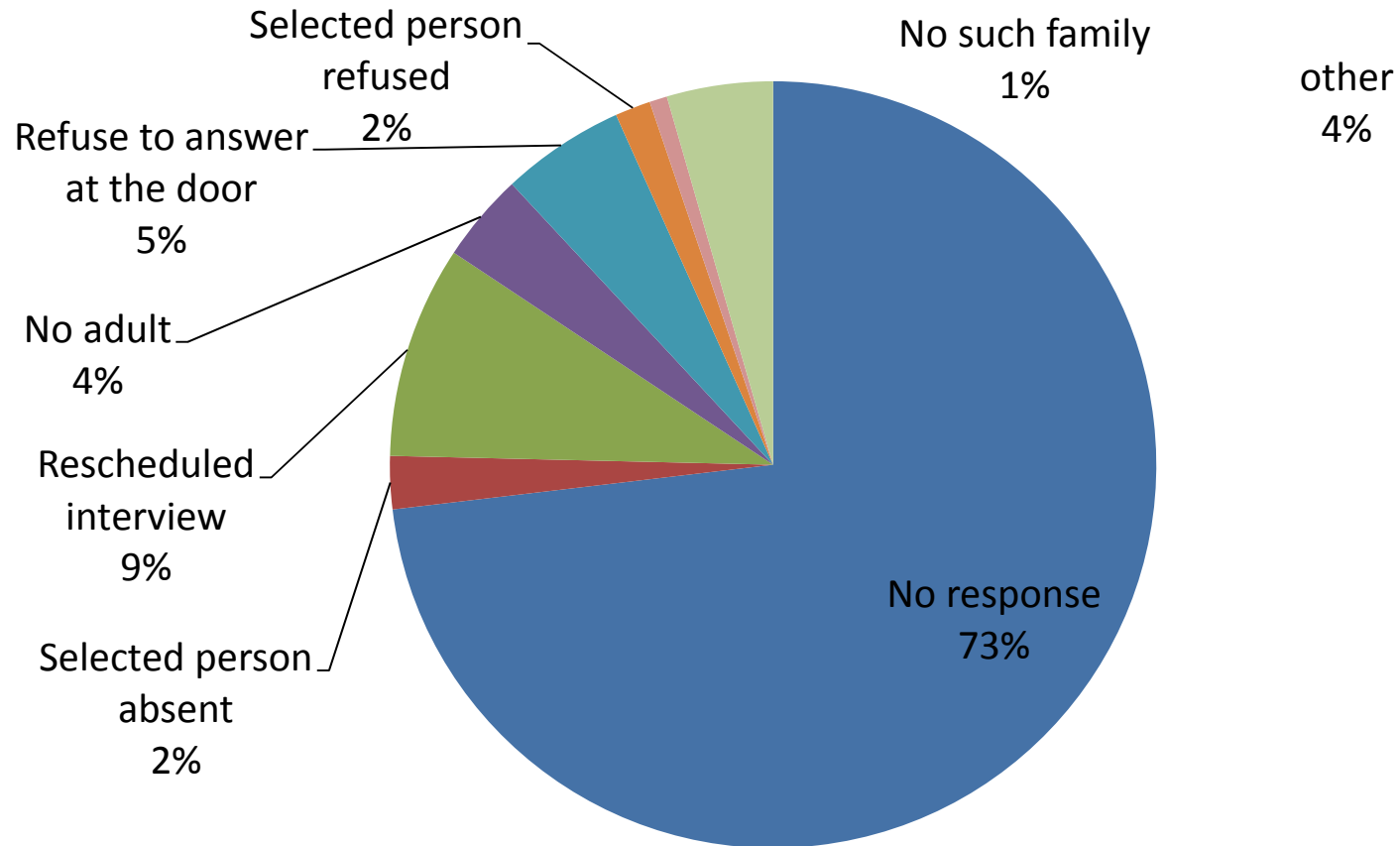
Reasons for not conducting the survey, 1 visit

From the total sample of 5005 households, elaborated during the survey were 4747 (94,84%). From them, 3768 (79,38%) people aged 15 – 64 fulfilled the questionnaire which data was incorporated in the data base. People aged 15-34 represents 1798 (47,72%) of the cases in the data base.
